Tory Chaos With Channel Crossings

In recent weeks, the government has been grappling with chaos surrounding our immigration and asylum system. Manston, a migrant holding centre in Kent, has unveiled the horrendous mismanagement of asylum seekers by Home Secretary Suella Braverman.

According to the BBC, the Home Secretary was warned that the government was breaching statutory duties by failing to sign off on ways to immediately move people to hotels or alternative accommodation. At the time, 4,000 migrants being housed there, despite it being meant to hold just 1,600 when it was built.

On the 31st of October, I did a number of media appearances where I outlined how the immigration system was broken as a result of Tory chaos and mismanagement.

As I said on LBC, "if the Home Secretary spent less time indulging in culture wars and a bit more time doing her job, not leaking things, not stirring up trouble... we would be in a much better place."

Although she married again, she kept a photo of her first love in the back of the brooch all her life. I wear it in honour of their love and his sacrifice.



Barbara Castle Memorial Event



On Sunday 6th November, I was invited to the Barbara Castle Memorial Event at Oxford University Labour Club.

Barbara Castle was MP for Blackburn from 1945-1979. She was the fourth woman in history to sit at the Cabinet table and served as Secretary of State for Transport, introducing the breathalyser, 70mph speed limit on motorways, and legislation requiring all cars to be fitted with seatbelts. She then served as Secretary for Employment and Productivity and First Secretary of State from 1968-1970. She also went on to successfully bring in the Equal Pay Act 1970

Barbara Castle was also a great internationalist who campaigned for the introduction of the Department of International Development.
