Terrible events in Israel and Gaza

Since the appalling October 7th attack and Israel's invasion and bombardment of Gaza, many constituents have shared heart-wrenching stories of friends and family members who have been killed, or whose lives are still at risk. My heart goes out to all of those with loved ones still under threat and I hope the global calls are heeded for the attacks on Gaza to stop, and for all hostages held by Hamas to be released.

I am gravely concerned by the intolerable and unacceptable humanitarian crisis and loss of civilian life we've seen in Gaza. As Shadow Attorney General, I will continue to call for all parties to this conflict to follow international law and for allegations of breaches to be treated with the utmost seriousness. I will always stand firm in my belief that Israel has a right to defend itself, but that right is not a blank cheque and they must urgently take concrete steps to prevent further civilian loss of life. And we urgently need a full, comprehensive and immediate humanitarian pause in the fighting across the whole of Gaza to ensure food, medicine, fuel and water can get to Gazans who desperately need it.

Those are the immediate priorities Labour is working towards, but I will also continue - as I always have done - to urge the international community to restart efforts to finding the lasting peace and a two-state solution that we so desperately need to end this cycle of violence once and for all. Neither Israel's security nor justice for Palestine can be delivered by bombs and bullets. We must seek a path to negotiations that can lead us to two states - a secure Israel and an independent Palestine.



Remembrance Sunday



The Islington community comes together every year to remember those whose lives have been taken by war. It is estimated that 2000 people from Islington died in service during World War II, and around 1400 Islington residents died in bombing across our borough.

So I was honoured, as I am every year, to lay wreaths marking Remembrance Sunday at Islington Green and Spa Green. And I was also delighted to be able to volunteer with members of my team to sell poppies in support of the Royal British Legion's vitally important annual appeal on the Friday before remembrance weekend.

The King's Speech

The King's Speech is meant to be an opportunity for the government to set out a bold, ambitious agenda for the next year in Parliament. But instead what we got from Rishi Sunak was incredibly thin gruel. As ordinary people up and down the country struggle with inflation and crumbling public services, it's shocking that there was nothing from the Prime Minister about the cost-of-living or the NHS

This is a government that is so out of touch and out of ideas that it thinks bringing back David Cameron is the answer voters are looking for! But we all know that what we really need is a general election so the public are finally allowed to give their verdict on thirteen years of Tory incompetence and chaos.
